#### A message from **An Taoiseach**

n 16th May 1926, our founders gathered in La Scala Theatre, Dublin. The meeting was chaired by Countess Markiewicz and addressed by Eamon de Valera, both veterans of the Easter Rising.

The La Scala meeting took place a decade after Patrick Pearse and James Connolly had brought together the republican and labour movements in revolutionary pursuit of Irish national self-determination. Fianna Fáil The Republican Party was established to vindicate the aims of the 1916 leaders.

The vision of the men and women who founded Fianna Fáil was of:

- an Ireland united, independent and at peace;
- an Ireland that is equal and fair;
- an Ireland that is prosperous
- an Ireland that provides for all its people, young and old.

That vision remains our vision today.

#### Introduction by James Lawless TD

ianna Fáil is an Irish republican party in the tradition of Tone and Emmet. Under the inspiring leadership of our founders, Fianna Fáil earned and enjoyed the trust of the Irish people for almost a century.

We are determined to retain that trust by reflecting the values and aspirations of the Irish people across our shared and changing island.

In doing this, our goal is to ensure that our party will be a driving force into the next century and beyond.

Change remains the only constant, and it is imperative to continually challenge ourselves as well as others, to ensure our mission remains relevant and robust for the world we live in today.

Our aims were first articulated at the party's foundation and largely aligned with the democratic programme of the first Dáil. These have been developed over the past twelve months, following intensive consultation and engagement with every level of the party, including every CDC, and indeed with valued external experts, advocates, and supporters. Ultimately it is the people of this Republic whom we serve. I want to thank and acknowledge the diligence, application and imagination of all commission members in this exercise and also to the many members and units of the organisation who shared their thoughts, views and visions with us across the many meetings and submissions we received.

I believe that these aims remain true to our party's ethos whilst representing a modern blueprint for governance in the 21st century. They capture the challenges of today whilst anticipating the future.

We stand, as always, on core values; the need to continue driving progress whilst protecting the more fragile parts of society; the desire to unite our island in a way that welcomes all communities, including those who have more recently come to these shores.

The imperative of re-imagining our lands and seas to reap a harvest of energy independence and food security - providing valuable new workstreams for rural and farming communities and wider economic opportunity to share those resources onwards - all in renewable, sustainable ways.

We believe in housing as a fundamental right and the dignity of one's own front door. We strongly support the aspiration to home ownership for all and will work to deliver on that commitment. We back the delivery of a diverse housing sector market by ensuring availability of affordable and quality accommodation and by protecting those in rental accommodation through security of tenure and fair rents.

We believe work must always be rewarded and enterprise encouraged; it provides the foundations on which all other progress is made possible. Education remains a core value which we are proud to champion, being the channel through which so many can advance, realise their full potential, and ensure the next generation has a better future. Research and innovation are also key to that journey.

We prioritise strong public services, with continuous innovation and improvement. They should be designed around the user, not for the institution. Healthcare is a basic need in its many forms. It is key to the social contract that government must work for our people. We strive to vindicate that charter across these aims. Our party aligns to a 'left of centre' philosophy which is reflected throughout this document. We believe this position holds true both to our history and our future.

It is my privilege to have led this project and I present our outputs below. This is not a policy manifesto, nor is it a detailed plan for implementation. This provides the foundations on which all that can follow. This is at once simpler and yet more profound. It is a statement of our core goals and mission.

From Fianna Fáil's foundation, our party has committed itself to a practical republicanism that is focused on raising the standard of living for ordinary people and showing that Ireland could overcome any barriers to its progress.

Eamon de Valera led Fianna Fáil into government for the first time in March 1932 and what followed were major advances for Irish sovereignty and significant improvement in our social and economic life.

Reflecting the party's compassionate left of centre perspective, Fianna Fáil put in place the foundations for the Irish welfare state, so as to offer a safety net to our most vulnerable citizens. Once in government, Fianna Fáil introduced unemployment assistance and increased the old age pension and commenced the slum clearance and social housing projects. Perhaps, de Valera's outstanding legacy was Bunreacht na hÉireann, a constitution that has stood the test of time and which enshrines the freedoms and liberties we enjoy as a people. It is a document all the more remarkable for being authored at a time when the clouds of oppression and dictatorship were descending across Europe.

Fianna Fáil, under the leadership of Seán Lemass, the politician most associated with Irish economic success, implemented the First Programme for Economic Expansion which opened up our economy, encouraged foreign direct investment and set our country on a path of significant growth. The education and welfare of Irish people has always been a core value of our party and the Fianna Fáil governments of the 1960s used our enhanced economic status as an engine to drive social inclusion. In this decade, free secondary school education was introduced by Donogh O'Malley and the Free Travel Scheme for our older citizens was introduced by Charles Haughey.

In 1973, under the leadership of Jack Lynch, Ireland joined the European Economic Community (EEC), a decision that has brought massive economic and social benefits to our nation and has established an enduring bond with our European neighbours. We are passionate believers in the European project and our place at the heart of Europe.


As Taoiseach, Charles Haughey was central to the emergence of the modern peace process. In 1993, the Downing Street Declaration was driven, negotiated and then signed by Albert Reynolds on behalf of the Irish Government. Building on this work, Bertie Ahern was a key player in a lasting peace settlement, the Good Friday Agreement, being reached. This has proved to be a game changer for peace and economic and social progress on our island. Brian Cowen, as Taoiseach, continued our party's dedication to peace and he and Brian Lenihan did their utmost in the face of a major global recession.

Micheál Martin was elected Taoiseach in the midst of the Covid pandemic. Our Taoiseach has shown tenacity and political skill in leading our country through this crisis. In July 2022, Ireland's unemployment rate fell to its lowest level in 21 years, which signifies a dramatic turnaround from the depths of Covid when almost a third of the labour force was without work.

We are determined to meet the challenges of the decades ahead with the same energy, determination and imagination and to keep leading our country forward.


